Regarding the presentations (general observations):

-the idea of "concept" is used in most cases as a point on a check list, not as the driving force of the project

-if there are trials of using the concept as a design tool, the interpretation is quite literal and does not bring real value to the end result.

-the technical documentation makes sense in a presentation if it illustrates an idea, rather than just to show it has been produced.

Personally, I would have liked to see more maturity, in depth research and courage in the approach considering that we are talking about diploma projects. I have seen it is possible in several cases, therefore I am sure there is a lot of hope for improvement.

Personally, I would like to see them do an in-depth documentation of the ideas more than the Technical Drawings.

Dear Cherif,

It was a pleasure to attend all of the crits and see the broad spectrum of talent across the senior year.

I think there are a number of general points from the presentation some of which have been previously mentioned:

- Spelling, lots of bad examples which distract a potential client from your message, yet so simple to check/fix
- Define a strong concept and be ruthless in its implementation throughout the project
- Utilise the graphics/imagery to tell a story of your project, with no superfluous slides (they can be in bound folders etc...)
- Demonstrate experimentation with light/materials/forms etc...
- Physical models as well as computer models are design tools, and should be utilised whether they are part of the final presentation requirements or not

There are also a number of specific issues which you might wish to consider for forthcoming years:

- I understand the mini thesis became the briefing element for the thesis project however some students changed afterwards and this is pretty evident in the presentations
- Greater understanding of materials/materiality
- Presentation skills
- Design process of defining a concept and implementing it prior to final thesis
- Weak projects to be rejected before final presentation stage
- Weekly external crits?

Dear Dr. Amor,

It was a real pleasure for me to participate in the Senior presentations last week.

Having briefly discussed this matter with Shaikha and with the support of Qatar Foundation, I would really welcome the opportunity to get more involved with the VCU - ID Program, not only for a 10' critique at the end of a Design Phase but to help the students and assist teachers during the project development as noted in your email.

As for my feedback regarding the sessions, please note the following:

- 10' minute duration for each presentation is appropriate. We all know how difficult it is to compress months of work in such a limited time but this is preparing them for real life.

- The presentations demonstrated that the students understand the importance of approaching a Design problem from a global perspective to the specifics of target markets and Client requirements.

- The works presented showed the connection of the Interior Design with the Architecture of the building. In some cases the Interior design challenged the Architecture. This was interesting to see.

- The students all have strong concepts but in the majority of the project the concept got diminished during the design process.

- Construction Documents were available during the presentations which shows students are not only learning about design but technical skills.

- Students were able to illustrate their design with beautiful computer renderings and hand sketches.

Some items for consideration:

- It would be helpful to see physical samples.

- Although it might not be required during a presentation, I would like to see more of the engineering coordination but I am not sure how this is address in the school.

Overall I think the students are being given with the right knowledge skills and well prepared for their professional careers as Interior designers.

That said, it would nice to see more innovations in term of concepts, ideas, materials, etc.

I am sure this is all addressed in the program and the reason why I think it would be more helpful as a reviewer to be involve from the beginning of the Design process.
